Charity Trustee Declaration—To be completed by Student Affairs Committee candidates only

If you are elected to the Students' Union Student Affairs Committee you will automatically become a member of the Board of Trustees, as the Students' Union has charitable status. There is a substantial body of legislation and case law concerned with our activities and with the conduct of the Student Affairs Committee who are trustees in effect of a charitable body. Below is a list of circumstances, which may prevent you from becoming a trustee, and you must sign this form agreeing that none of the following apply to you if you wish to stand for position.

You are not allowed to be a trustee if you:

- Are under 18 years of age
- Have been convicted of an offence at any time involving deception or dishonesty, unless the conviction is legally regarded as sent
- Are an un-discharged bankrupt
- Have at any time been removed by the Commissioners or by the Court of England, Wales or Scotland from being a trustee because of misconduct
- Are disqualified from bring a company director
- Have failed to make payments under the County Court administrator's orders.

If you are in any doubt about your eligibility to act as a trustee you should contact the Returning Officer.
